The Candidates for Ordination (2019)

Deacon Anthony Joseph Astrab is a native Floridian born in Dunedin. He grew up in Palm Harbor and Tarpon Springs with St. Ignatius of Antioch in Tarpon Springs as his home parish. Anthony attended Our Lady of Lourdes Catholic School from 5th to 8th grade and Jesuit High School in Tampa (2004). He received a Bachelor of Science in Accounting (2008) and a Master of Science in Entrepreneurship in Applied Technologies (2010) from the University of South Florida. After college, everything seemed to be falling into place. He was making good money buying, fixing up, and selling houses, and he found what he thought would be his future wife. In the midst of all this though, there was a restlessness and a certain sense of incompleteness. After about a year and a half of struggling, praying, and discerning, Anthony and his girlfriend separated, he stopped looking for houses to remodel, and he entered the seminary in 2012. Anthony was ordained as a transitional Deacon on May 14, 2018. As a seminarian, Anthony has served in the following parishes: St. Raphael (St. Petersburg), Nativity (Brandon), and Our Lady of Lourdes (Dunedin). Reverend Anthony Astrab will begin his first priestly assignment as Parochial Vicar at Nativity Parish in Brandon.

Deacon Ralph D'Elia is a fourth generation Tampa native. After experiencing a life changing conversion in high school, he began discerning a call to the priesthood. However, after some time he chose to travel a different path. Following high school, he decided to embark on a future in law and politics. Contrary to what he anticipated, the more he immersed himself in realizing his own plans the more he recognized that those plans were incapable of fulfilling his deepest desires. Grateful for the experiences of his four years in college it became clear that the time had come to follow Christ in the particular way in which he was being called. Upon graduating from the University of South Florida, he entered St. John Vianney College Seminary in Miami where he studied philosophy. As a seminarian for the Diocese of St. Petersburg, Ralph has served in the following parishes: St. Timothy (Lutz), St. Cecelia (Clearwater) and St. Stephen (Riverview). Reverend Ralph D'Elia will return to Rome following his ordination to continue his studies and return to the Diocese of Saint Petersburg in 2020 for his first priestly assignment.

The Candidates for Ordination (2019)

Deacon Joshua Hare was born in Florida and raised in Memphis, Tennessee. For the past ten years, he has lived in the city of Brooksville just north of the Tampa Bay area. His home parish is St. Anthony the Abbot with Fr. Paul Pecchie as Pastor. He earned his Bachelor of Arts in philosophy at St. John Vianney College Seminary. He will receive a Master of Divinity from St. Vincent De Paul Regional Seminary in May of this year. One reason that he feels called to the priesthood is because he wants to bring the joy and love of Christ to his brothers and sisters through the Eucharist. As a seminarian for the Diocese of St. Petersburg, Joshua has served in the following parishes: St. Rita (Dade City), St. Lawrence (Tampa) and Holy Cross (St. Petersburg). EXAMINATION OF THE CANDIDATES

By a series of questions, the bishop asks the elect to express their desire and willingness to be ordained a priest and to fulfill the responsibilities that come with ordination.

PROMISE OF OBEDIENCE



IMPOSITION OF HANDS

IMPOSICIÓN DE LAS MANOS

Following the ancient custom found in Scripture, the bishop places his hands upon the head of the elect, praying in solemn silence for the gift of the Holy Spirit. Then all of the concelebrating priests who are present lay hands upon the elect. During this ritual gesture, *Veni Creator Spiritus* will be sung by the Diocesan Choir.

PRAYER OF ORDINATION

ALL STAND / DE PIE

The bishop extends his hands over the elect who are kneeling before him and prays that they may be worthy of the ministry upon which they will embark.

INVESTITURE WITH STOLE & CHASUBLE

Assisted by members of the presbyterate, the newly ordained priests are vested with the stole and chasuble, the outer vestments worn by the priest during the celebration of the Eucharist.

ANOINTING OF THE HANDS

The bishop anoints the hands of the new priests with sacred Chrism that had been consecrated at the Chrism Mass during Holy Week 2019.

PRESENTATION OF THE GIFTS

PRESENTACIÓN DE LAS OFRENDAS


The bishop receives the gifts of bread and wine from the people. The paten and chalice that have been prepared for the celebration of Mass are then presented to the newly ordained priests by the bishop.

KISS OF PEACE
