OFFICE OF FAITH FORMATION

Faith Formation is an office within the Department of Evangelization and Lifelong Faith Formation, which seeks to support local parish efforts to evangelize the people of God and nourish the formation of the Church through all ages and phases of life. In our work within all parishes of the Diocese, we:

- strive to <u>encounter</u> Jesus in our lives through Word and Sacrament and foster this encounter in the lives of children, youth and adults
- work to <u>lead</u> people to transformation in Christ and an integration of their Roman Catholic faith with their life experiences
- <u>serve</u> those who live and minister with and for people of faith in our local and diocesan communities

The functions of the diocesan Faith Formation staff include:

- Faith formation for leadership development and administration
 provides ongoing education and support to parish leadership
 including religious education coordinators in our Catholic schools,
 Rite of Christian Initiation of Adults coordinators and parish
 directors of faith formation; as well as curriculum development
 for K-8, high school parish/school, safe environment education
 programs, family life and human sexuality, which directly
 impacts the 17,127 parish faith formation and 15,486
 Catholic school students in K-12.
- Personnel support in relation to the hiring process, orientation, supervision/evaluation, professional development, and recognition of parish and Catholic school faith formation leaders. This includes all aspects from prospective employee identification to vetting, which assists parishes and schools in securing the most qualified and most appropriate candidates for religious formation staff positions.
- Catechist formation and continuing education is provided for certified catechists who serve children, youth and adults and all Catholic school teachers/staff members. The program is concerned with the faith development of the catechist as well as the doctrinal content of the faith and sound, age appropriate and culturally sensitive methodology. It consists of 3 levels with continuing growth (education) hours required at all levels: Basic, Advanced and Master catechist, and the Basic Level is available in both English and Spanish. The program also provides/renders Florida Teacher Certification Renewal Points, and celebrates 2,000-3,000 active participants throughout the Diocese with over 7,600 graduates to date.
