# **OBJECTIONS/FAQ**

### Covid-19:

- The work of the Church of Washington is ongoing and continues to need your support
- Every ministry and program of the Archdiocese has continued operations through this pandemic, finding new and creative ways to serve our parishes, the local faithful and all those in need of spiritual and pastoral nourishment
- Questions/concerns about clergy sexual abuse:
  - No funds from the Appeal are used to pay legal bills or settlements involving clergy sexual abuse.
    Every dollar raised is used exclusively to support local ministries.
  - The Archdiocese of Washington is committed to keeping children safe and to bringing healing to those harmed.
  - Any allegations of abuse of a minor or vulnerable adult must be reported to police and other appropriate government agencies, as well as our Office for Child and Youth Protection and Safe Environment.
- I feel the only way my voice is heard is if I withhold support:
  - Archbishop Gregory is listening and as he visits parishes throughout the archdiocese wants to hear more from you personally.
  - The Archdiocese of Washington has procedures in place to report financial or other misconduct using EthicsPoint, an independent reporting service.
- Questions/concerns about Cardinal Wuerl:

- Pope Francis accepted the resignation of Cardinal Wuerl as the Archbishop of Washington on October 12, 2018. If prospect is still upset/has questions, leave a detailed comment.
- Why was the name of the appeal changed?
  - o The Appeal has had many names over its 51-year history. What has not changed is the Annual Appeal's mission to help the Church of Washington and to support the good works of the Church. For this reason, we named the campaign 'Annual Appeal'. Also, with our new leader being an Archbishop, it was no longer appropriate to keep the name 'Cardinal's Appeal'.
- Why support the Annual Appeal instead of individual Catholic ministries?
  - The Annual Appeal provides a way for each of us to support critical services and ministries of the Church in an efficient, effective and meaningful way, and to support ministries larger than any particular parish or agency.
  - Many ministries supported by the Annual Appeal do not receive direct support.
  - One-hundred-percent of donations go directly to the missions and ministries supported by the Annual Appeal. The Archdiocese of Washington pays for expenses related to conducting the Appeal through other revenue sources.
- Is there a minimum donation?
  - No. We provide all supporters the opportunity to prayerfully support the Annual Appeal according to the gifts God has given. As each has means, we together improve the lives of thousands and strengthen our local ministry and outreach.
- What is the cost to conduct the Annual Appeal each year?
  - The annual cost for outreach, gift and data processing, pledge reminders, gift acknowledgements and other correspondence relating to the Annual Appeal is seven (7) pennies per dollar raised. The funds to cover these cost come from revenue sources outside the Appeal.
- How can I be sure that my support for the Annual Appeal will go to the missions and ministries listed?

- When a nonprofit such as the Archdiocese of Washington promotes a charitable campaign with specific elements, such as the Annual Appeal, it is considered donor-restricted giving. Funds raised for the Annual Appeal must be applied to the elements of the Appeal (or we must receive donor permission to redirect funds if the project has changed).
- Annual Appeal donations are separate from other funds and accounts to ensure that 100% of every donation to the Annual Appeal is applied to ministries supported by the Annual Appeal.
