Financial Operations of the Pastoral Center

Our diocesan ministries, education and outreach programs offer support, professional guidance and direct delivery of services to and for our people, parishes, schools and communities. And everything they do is made possible with the support and generosity of our donors and prayerful supporters. As stewards of these gifts, we are committed to transparency. This Annual Report includes a comprehensive overview of the operational expenses and revenues associated with our traditional diocesan ministry and service areas, supported through donations to the Annual Pastoral Appeal (APA) and parish assessments. It also includes impact reporting from several of our major ministries, as well as some comparative information for year over year review. LARGER MINISTRY SUPPORT & IMPACT

The ministries of the Diocese of St. Petersburg operate on a very tight annual budget, relying on specific revenue sources, including interest earnings, donations and grants, bequests, parish assessment payments and direct donations to the Annual Pastoral Appeal (APA). **Did you know...**

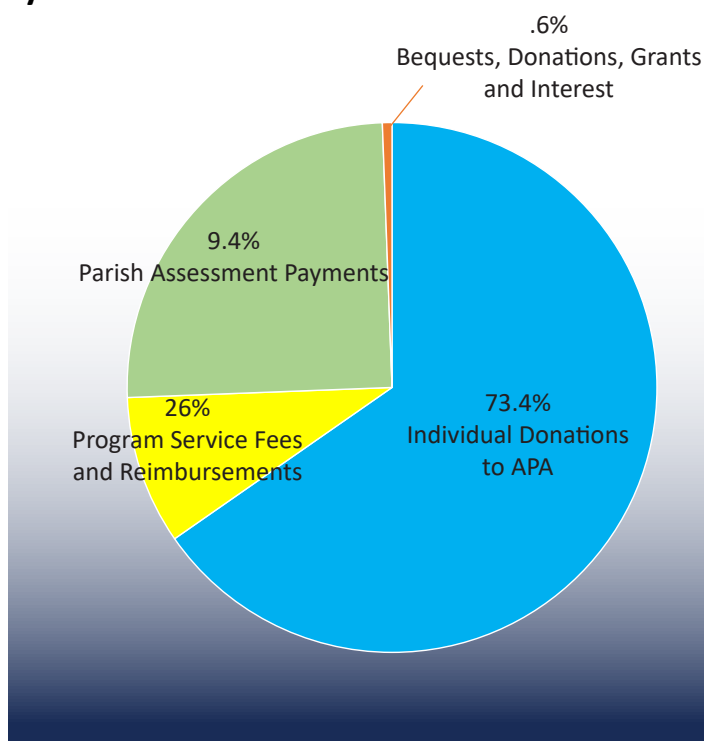
- † 73% of our total budget comes from direct donations
- † While our Annual Pastoral Appeal runs on a calendar year, our budget is based on a fiscal-year?
- † The donations we receive through the annual APA effort are budgeted for use in the following year? This means that donations made to APA 2020 will be used in 2021.
- † **Of our 2019-2020 total non-program revenue of \$11,366,923, roughly \$10 million came from parishioner donations to our 2019 Annual Pastoral Appeal.** There is no possible way our larger ministries could continue outreach efforts without those gifts.

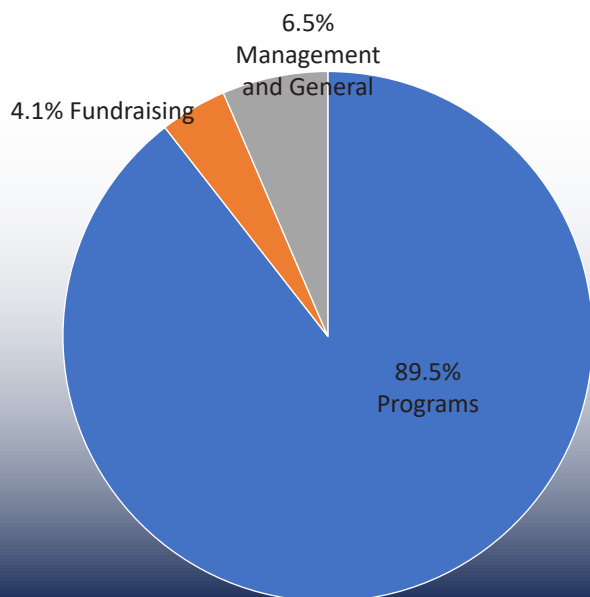

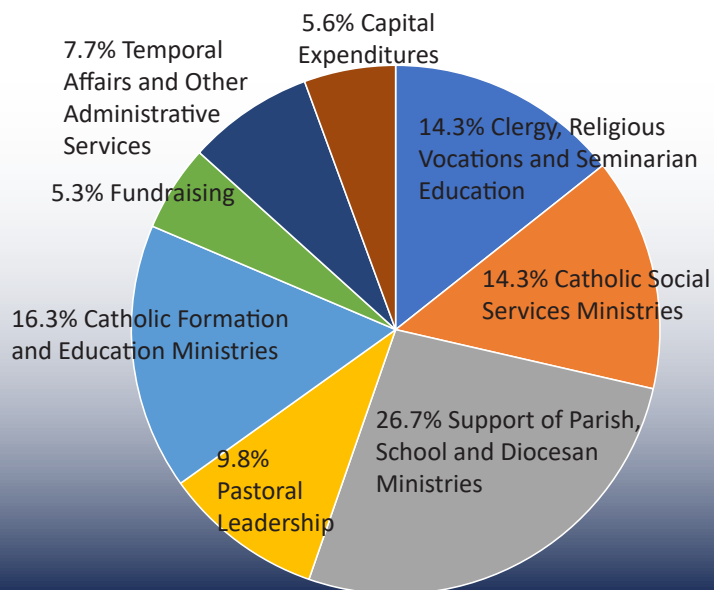

Total Gross Expenses by Ministry Department:

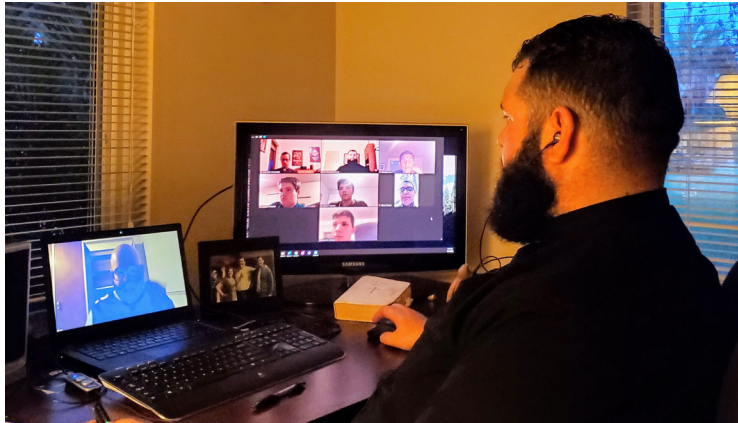


Ministry Impact

In 2020, our dedication to our Mission did not waiver even through incredibly challenging circumstances. With perseverance, dedication and courage, our diocesan ministries and programs jumped into unknown territory.

Our diocesan staff continue to adapt, finding creative ways to serve our people as well as those who serve our parishes and communities. Below are program highlights from this past year's efforts along with impact information for Vocations, Youth and Young Adult Ministry, Catholic Charities and Communications. VOCATIONS



In response to shutdowns and closures, our Vocations Office became a leader in using digital communications to ensure they provided every possible opportunity for those discerning a call to the priesthood to encounter the Lord and grow in their fidelity to Him.

From the successful implementation of virtual discernment opportunities such as *Zoom Chat With Seminarians*, *Facebook Live with Future Fathers* (10,300+ people reached) and monthly live stream *Virtual Abundance Holy Hours for Vocations* (1,000+ views), their proactive approach yielded fantastic results for our diocese:


- † 3 men Ordained August 2020
- † 7 new seminarians in fall 2020
- † 15 men in formation at St. Vincent de Paul Regional Seminary and St. John Vianney College Seminary

YOUTH AND YOUNG ADULT MINISTRY



In June, the Good Samaritan Project, our award-winning service-based retreat for high school age children, was completely restructured to provide a safe and healthy environment for participants and organizers. Within one month, the traditional

in-person week-long overnight program held at Bishop McLaughlin Catholic High School in Spring Hill transitioned to a 7 day-hybrid event featuring localized and virtual service projects, spiritual formation and community building. The unique 2020 event served:

CATHOLIC CHARITIES



In their 75th year, Catholic Charities was faced with expanded need from all areas of our community. Throughout a year fraught with difficulties, they successfully maintained their mission to serve and expanded their outreach:

- † In March 2020, a temporary shelter called Hillsborough Hope was opened in collaboration with officials from the City of Tampa. Almost 10,000 meals were served over two months, and 210 clients were offered medical and mental health sessions. We are currently working with the City of Tampa to find a permanent location for this ministry of mercy.

- † 82,000+ meals were served to the almost 1,500 clients at Pinellas Hope along with almost case management, medical appointments, counseling sessions and GED training

- † The affordable housing initiative made strides throughout our 5 counties including affordable housing for 12 families at Bethany Family Apartments in Pasco County, 18 new affordable housing units at St. Benedict in Citrus County, 55 residents served at Bella Vista in Hillsborough County, housing for 14 veterans in the 12 units at the new St. Teresa site in Hernando County, and completing permitting for 18 new units at St. Benedict in Citrus County

COMMUNICATIONS



Last year gave our diocesan leaders added insight into the importance of developing and maintaining strong virtual and digital platforms for effectively getting information to and receiving information from the people we serve. The Communications Office was essential in the planning and implementation of:

- † Social media presence reaching 232,028 engaged Facebook users, 38,000 YouTube views and 150,000+ engaged followers

- † Virtual updates to all about the dispensation of the Sunday Mass obligation and the safety directives required

Forward in Faith

In late 2019, plans were made to wind down the redemption phase for the *Forward in Faith* Capital Campaign as of December 31, 2019. At that time, we announced in the 2019 Annual Report the campaign would be ending and provided what we thought would be a final reporting of total donations. Included in the report was an outline of the diocesan projects we completed: a new residence and updated education facilities at St. Vincent de Paul Regional Seminary, a new building for our oldest regional Catholic school, St. Anthony in San Antonio; and the completion of the new regional Mother Teresa of Calcutta Catholic school in Lutz.



After the 2019 report was distributed, however, many dedicated donors requested an extension in order to fulfill their commitments. **In 2020, these faithful donors contributed almost \$315,000 and final payments will be accepted through the end of February 2021.**

Donors have now contributed more than \$28 million. **Through Parish Share, a major component of the campaign, by January 2019 all qualifying parishes had received 20 cents of every dollar paid which totaled over \$4 million.** A final payment was scheduled for early 2020 in anticipation of the campaign's end. However, the pandemic added to requests from donors led to the campaign remaining open through 2020.



An updated all parish summary and accounting for the *Forward in Faith* Campaign is provided below. **Currently, \$204,000 is scheduled for distribution to 72 parishes.** After the conclusion of the campaign on February 28, 2021, we will prepare a final Parish Share distribution.



In addition, the remaining diocesan portion of donations will be allocated to the remaining projects originally outlined in the campaign materials: Catholic school tuition assistance and/or support of retired clergy. 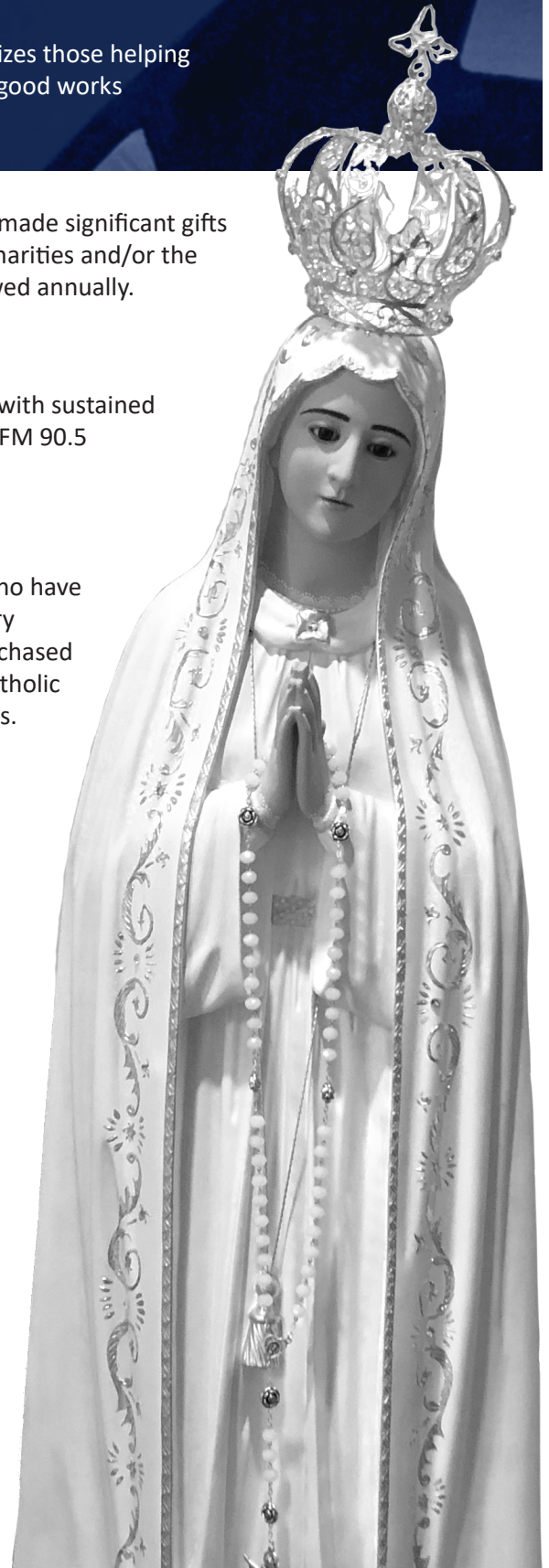
