

SAFE HAVEN SUNDAY Sunday, August 21, 2022

What is it?

Safe Haven Sunday is a weekend set aside by our diocese to address the harms of pornography. Within the context of the Mass, parishes can provide teaching and resources that will support individuals, marriages, and families in making all homes a safe haven. It is inspired by the United States Conference of Catholic Bishops' 2015 formal statement, Create in Me a Clean Heart: A Pastoral Response to Pornography. In that statement, the bishops explain that "[t]he use of pornography by anyone in the home deprives the home of its role as a safe haven and has negative effects throughout a family's life and across generations."

Have this been held before in the Diocese of St. Petersburg?

You may recall that we offered our first *Safe Haven Sunday* in Lent of 2019. Others occurred in 2020 and 2021. At the request of some pastors, the Presbyteral Council decided to move the annual event to the 21st Sunday in Ordinary Time and restart the program in 2022.

Why?

Simply put, pornography is a pervasive problem in our society that affects our parishioners – individuals and families. *Safe Haven Sunday* seeks to address this in a pastorally appropriate way and provide teaching and resources that support individuals, marriages, and families in making all homes a safe haven.

It may help them create a safer digital environment for themselves and their children.

The 21st Sunday in Ordinary Time has been chosen because the readings offer the mes that are applicable to the sin of pornography. "Enter through the narrow gate," might remind us that in a culture seemingly saturated with sex, we are called to purity which is most certainly a narrow gate. You will, undoubtedly find others and have the pastoral sensitivity to find ways to address this topic.
