The Saint Jude the Apostle Medal was commissioned for the Diocese of Saint Petersburg in 1999 at the request of the Most Reverend Robert N. Lynch, fourth bishop of Saint Petersburg. The famous Italian sculptor, Enrico Manfrini (1917-2004) of Milan, designed the medal and it was cast by the Senesi Foundry of Milan. The medal is given each year in the Diocese of Saint Petersburg as a way to recognize those persons showing distinguished and outstanding service to their parish. This medal acknowledges the great gift of the Church, its people, exemplified in these individuals who through their generosity and love of their faith have greatly contributed to spreading the Gospel of Jesus Christ in their parish community.



▼ THE PSALMODY

The heart of the Liturgy of the Hours is the psalmody. Consisting of inspired psalms and canticles from the Scriptures, the psalmody helps the community enter into a deeper realization of the mystery of the presence of God. The psalmody may fall into the categories of praise, thanksgiving, lament or instruction, depending on the focus of the particular celebration.



4. The wedding feast of the Lamb has begun, and his bride is prepared to welcome him.

All: Alleluia! All: Alleluia, alleluia!

5. Glory to the Father, and to the Son, and to the Holy Spirit, All: Alleluia! as it was in the beginning, is now, and will be for ever. Amen. All: Alleluia, alleluia!

All sing together to conclude the canticle.

But grace was given to each of us according to the measure of Christ's gift.

HOMILY

Evening Prayer is a part of the Church's Liturgy of the Hours. Christians of the first four centuries would have been as familiar with this liturgical prayer form as they were with Sunday Eucharist because they framed their day with prayer.

The "hinges" of the Liturgy of the Hours are Morning and Evening Prayer. During Morning Prayer, we dedicate the day to the Lord and ask that our work, and the work of the Church, is blessed so that we become leaven for the world. In Evening Prayer, we thank God for the gift of light (i.e., Christ our Light) and we make petition for divine protection during the night.



Refrain: Sing at the cantor's direction




Verses

- 4. He has helped his servant Israel, remembering his mercy. He promised his mercy to Abraham and his children for evermore.




