Weight Watchers (WW):

When meeting with new members, the group leader asks them:

"What's your why?"

What is the long-term motivation for you to lose weight?

- When volunteer ministers/disciples understand the "why" of their ministry, along with its long-term impact, their level of commitment will be deeper.
- Not just "volunteers," but "ministers and disciples."

- EXAMPLE: Jennifer agrees to teach her son's 2nd grade Faith Formation class, a long-term (about 9-month) commitment.
- We want to prepare her to "run the marathon" successfully.
- <u>First</u>, help her to see the potential longterm impact of her ministry.

- What is the potential long-term impact of Jennifer's ministry as catechist?
- Also, what are some ways to give Jennifer the best chance of success in her ministry?
