
The mailing to previous donors will take place mid-November, and the pastor support mailing to all households will drop mid-January. Therefore, you may receive 2024 *Catholic Ministry Appeal* gifts and commitments in the collection basket as early as December 2023.

The following procedures have been established to expedite the remittance of gifts and commitments to the Campaign Processing Office to ensure donors are acknowledged accurately and quickly.



GIFTS OF LOOSE CASH

- Cash should not be sent through the mail.
- Must be deposited by the parish into the parish account. Once deposited, a check to the Diocese with the original envelopes should include: DUID, first name, last name, address, parish envelope number, payment amount and pertinent payment type. Check for the total amount of the cash gifts should be forwarded to the Campaign Processing Office with notation of "anonymous cash gifts." Any cash donations received at the parish must be deposited by the parish.

 - QR Code
 - Information must be accessible even on Live Stream
 - Electronic Devices must be "on"

Commitment Weekends: The Invitation

A robust ASK/INVITATION (three-to-five minutes)

- Intentionally COLLECT the commitment cards at the time of the invitation
 - Completes the invitation with an action step
 - Coordinate with the Ushers
 - Not an afterthought

Commitment Weekends: Follow-up

• 70% to 85% were not at Mass the previous weekend – did not hear your message or invitation.

• It takes time to hear your invitation, understand your invitation, accept your invitation and act on your invitation. Repeating the message is okay and expected.

• Invite everyone to pick up the commitment card again (invite those who already committed to serve as a witness to others by joining in the exercise).







EIGHT MEN ORDAINED AS PERMANENT DEACONS

The Diaconate Program & Formation Ministry is one of six diocesan ministries that embrace God's call to serve, and actively carry out His mission and ministry with love, gratitude and concern for others. These ministries encourage all to act, expressing God's saving love within us. Through the Catholic Ministry Appeal,

this group will receive \$2.7 million, or 31%, of the total \$9 million appeal goal to carry out their good works.



More than 100 Deacons serve throughout our diocese at parishes as well as in larger ministries such as Tampa and Pinellas Hope, and St. Vincent de Paul, and in our communities at hospitals, fire departments, and police and sheriff departments. Wherever a need is identified by Bishop Parkes, our deacons step in to

Our Diaconate Office offers ongoing guidance to them in their ministry and continuing formation opportunities, In addition, they also plan and supervise the diaconate formation program, bringing new men into this vital ministry.

This past October, we celebrated the Ordination of eight men to the Permanent Diaconate - one of the largest groups



newly Ordained and now serving at Our Lady of the Rosary Parish in Land O'Lakes. "We helped each other all through out in different ways, whether it was academic or struggling with something in life. We have really formed great friendships that will continue."

The multi-year formation process is vigorous and includes graduate level coursework. As many candidates are married with children or grandchildren, the commitment of time can be daunting. However, as Deacon Shawn Ryan now serving at St. Stephen Parish in Valrico shared, it was a very rewarding experience. "Its impact on my life, my marriage, my relationship with my daughter... we've grown together personally, spiritually, in our lives, in the parish."



TRANSFORMING OUR LIVES IN CHRIST

The Eucharistic Revival and **Encounter, and Mission Advancement** Initiatives is one of 7 diocesan ministries that is instrumental in the formation of the faithful as "Missionary Disciples," serving as living witnesses to Christ's message and love and serving those most in need. Through the Catholic Ministry Appeal, this group

of ministries will receive \$2.3 million, or 26%. of the total \$9 million appeal goal to carry out their good works.



"At first, when I came, I didn't know if I wanted to come," said Paul Nguyen, Holy Martyrs of Vietnam Parishioner. "But when I stepped in this environment, the Holy Spirit got me. It got me excited. After listening to the first song, I felt or encountered the Spirit coming to me. And then the first speaker was talking to us about Jesus wanting to be closer."

Paul was one of nearly 700 people representing 65 churches from all five counties of our Diocese attended the **Eucharistic Encounter on September** 16, 2023, at the JW Marriott Hotel in downtown Tampa. And another 700 joined throughout the day via livestream to renew their devotion to Jesus in the Eucharist. Speakers

at the event included Curtis Martin of FOCUS, Father Tim Anastos of the Archdiocese of Chicago, Sister Ana Chiara of the Disciples of the Lord Jesus Christ, John Bergsma of the St. Paul Center, and Mother Olga Yaqob of the Sacred Heart, founder of the Daughters of Mary of Nazareth.

"We have talked so much today about the Lord's presence," said Bishop Parkes in his Homily. "He will be truly present on this altar before us here this evening. How will this encounter today be transformational in your life?"

Upon leaving Deacon Rafael Ferreris. Jr., of Sacred Heart Parish Tampa shared, "Today was so much more than I could have ever imagined. I have

had a great love for the Eucharist, but today this is such a beautiful shot in the arm... thank you for bringing us here today and allowing us to participate in this. And I thank our diocese for hosting this - I hope to see




