DAY-BY-DAY ITINERARY

TAMPA/ACROSS THE ATLANTIC

TUESDAY, NOV 10

Depart this evening from Tampa on board your overnight transatlantic jet flight.

ARRIVE LISBON

WEDNESDAY, NOV 11

Arrive today in the capital city of Lisbon. In the 15th Century, Portugal was the first nation to begin exploration and trade far from the shores of the Mediterranean. Upon arrival in Lisbon, transfer to your hotel. (D)

LISBON/FATIMA

THURSDAY, NOV 12

After breakfast enjoy a brief orientation tour of Lisbon before departing for the village of Fatima, the world's most famous Marian shrine. Here, on the thirteenth of each month between May and October in 1917, the Blessed Mother appeared to three young children and exhorted the world to pray for world peace. Your visit this afternoon will include the Basilica of Our Lady of Fatima, site of Francisco and Jacinta's graves, and the Little Chapel of Apparitions with the statue of "Our Lady of Fatima." Time for devotion and worship. (B,D)

FATIMA/COIMBRA/BRAGA/ SANTIAGO DE COMPOSTELA

FRIDAY, NOV 13

Depart today for Santiago de Compostela, famed pilgrimage center since the Middle Ages and Spain's holiest city. As you drive through the Portuguese countryside, you will see the holy cities of Coimbra and Braga. Coimbra is the site of the Monastery of St. Clare, which is the resting place of Queen Santa Isabel, patron saint of Portugal. In Braga, see the National Shrine of the Immaculate Conception of Portugal on Mt. Sameiro, and the Shrine of the "Good Jesus" on Mt. Espinh. (B,D)

SANTIAGO DE COMPOSTELA

SATURDAY, NOV 14

Your morning tour of Santiago de Compostela, the capital city of Galicia, will include the magnificent 12th century Romanesque and Baroque cathedral housing the remains of St. James, patron saint of Spain. You will also see the various buildings of the University, one of Europe's oldest. The balance of the day is at leisure. (B)

SANTIAGO DE COMPOSTELA/SALAMANCA

SUNDAY, NOV 15

Today you will travel through the provinces of Galicia, journeying through wild and mountainous countryside with undulating farmlands to the old university town of Salamanca for overnight. (B,D)

SALAMANCA/AVILA/EL ESCORIAL/MADRID

MONDAY, NOV 16

Depart today for the walled city of Avila where St. Teresa founded the Order of Carmelites and then to Segovia, famous for its Alcazar and a still functioning Roman aqueduct. Cross the rugged Sierra de Guadarrama stopping at El Escorial. All but two of Spain's kings are interred in the Royal Pantheon of this monastery-palace which also contains paintings by Velazquez and El Greco. Afterwards continue your spiritual journey to Madrid, the capital city of Spain. (B,D)

TUESDAY, NOV 17

This morning you will see the white-trimmed 2,800-room Royal Palace and the exquisite gardens that surround it, the Puerta del Sol, Cervantes Memorial, the Plaza de Espana, the acacia-lined Castellana, and the Avenida Jose Antonio. Then visit the Prado Museum, housing a collection of masterpieces by Spain's artists Velazquez, Goya and El Greco. Your afternoon is at leisure for shopping or exploring on your own. **(B)**

MADRID/ZARAGOZA/BARCELONA

WEDNESDAY, NOV 18

Depart from the heart of Spain and travel east to Barcelona, the cultural center of the country. Time permitting, en-route enjoy a brief stop in Zaragoza to view the Basilica of the Virgin of the Pilar. Afterwards, continue to your hotel in Barcelona for the night. **(B,D)**

BARCELONA

THURSDAY, NOV 19

Barcelona is the cultural and political center of Catalonia and Spain's most European city. The city itself is divided into two major parts: the older area symbolized by the Gothic Quarter and the more modern part with its wide avenues. This morning enjoy a city tour including a visit to the Gothic Quarter. See the Gothic palaces of the Government of Catalonia and the City Hall, and the world-famous Cathedral with its fine medieval cloister and arcades. Next visit the towering La Sagrada Familia Church designed by the Catalan architect Antoni Gaudí. Begun in 1882, the church is still under construction today. The afternoon is at leisure to further explore this magnificent city on your own. You may wish to do more sightseeing, shopping or perhaps take time to relax and try some tapas at a sidewalk café. **(B)**

BARCELONA/TAMPA

FRIDAY, NOV 20

Your pilgrimage is over as you drive to the airport in time for your return flight back to Tampa, arriving the same day. **(B)**
