

# CELLPHONE POLICY



- **Good Samaritans should NOT bring cellphones**

This policy should be taken very seriously. Cellphones should not be onsite, not just left in your child's bag, left at home.

When you register your child for the Good Samaritan Project you agree that your child will not bring a cellphone on site. Good Samaritan Project **DOES NOT** permit high-school participants to bring cellphones or other internet capable devices. An adult chaperone **finding a cellphone/other internet capable device/charger on site (including in the sleeping quarters)** is grounds for a participant being sent home without a refund.

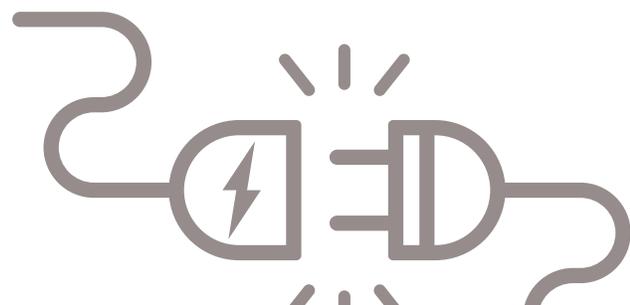
- **What if my child needs/wants to contact me?**

Don't worry! Your group leaders will have a cellphone that your child can use to contact their guardian(s) at anytime.

- **What if I need/want to contact my child?**

Speak with your group leader about the best means of contact. Your group leader will be able to put you in contact with your child if the need arises.

# DRESS CODE



**Chest, stomach, and back should be covered at all times. All tops should have sleeves.** Good Samaritan's should be able to lift their hands above their heads and sit down/stand up from the ground maintaining this coverage. Shirts cannot be longer than shorts. This means that tank tops, muscle tanks, cut-offs, deep v necklines, crop tops, etc. are not acceptable for GSP.

**Bottoms must be at least the length of the wearer's pointer finger when shoulders are at rest with arms hanging by their sides.** This standard applies to both men and women and is not impacted by a Good Samaritan's height/arm length. Please take care not to pack overly short or tight shorts as they are not conducive to our service work: longer shorts are the best choice. Your child will not be permitted to remain on site without clothing that meets this dress code.

**Appropriate shoes must be worn at all times** Closed-toed shoes with backs are required at all service sites at all times with no exceptions. The same is required for those participating in sporting activities in the gym/on the field. While closed toed shoes are not required for Rec. time/programming, reasonable footwear with soles must still be worn at all times outside of sleeping/showering.

**Any graphics/language on apparel/belongings should be representative of a devoted Catholic Youth Program, appropriate to the Mission of the Good Samaritan Project, and refrain from utilizing anything provocative, political, profane, or that could be understood as promoting an attitude of hate/bullying or disdain for the teachings of the Catholic Church.**

## What happens if my child breaks dress code?

A Group Leader will ask your child to change, every time. Proper attire for activities like service is a safety protocol. Anyone out of compliance will not be permitted to participate in program activities until a change is made, including service sites. Refusal to change will result in your child's dismissal from the program without a refund. Nobody wants your child to miss out on GSP or have to have a dress code conversation, prevent this from happening by helping your child pack.

# WHAT TO BRING

## THE GOOD SAMARITAN PROJECT PROVIDES:

*Official GSP shirts for every day of service (4), a small draw-string backpack, work gloves and a twin sized air mattress.*

- Shorts/Pants/Shoes for Service Sites**  
These could get stained at service sites so please pack accordingly. Shoes must be sturdy, closed-toed, and have backs. Please bring at least one pair of pants in case it is required for a specific service site. Ensure short's length is in accordance with the dress code: this policy will be enforced.
- Clothing for Rec. Time/Evening Program**  
*Comfortable, casual, modest clothing/shoes to change into after showering on service days. . Closed-toed shoes with backs will be required to play spots in gym/ on the field.*
- Pajamas**  
*Keep in mind that the dress code applies to sleep wear and that BMCHS can get pretty cold at night!*
- Re-usable Water Bottle**  
*Groups will have a jug of water to fill their bottle at service sites. Please make sure your name is on your bottle. GSP provides water but not bottles.*
- Hat/Sunglasses/Sunscreen**  
Most of your service will likely be outside in the sun. Bring what you need to be comfortable and safe.
- Bedding/Pillow/Towel**  
Twin size sheet set and blanket or sleeping bag. A pillow. A towel or two for showering. (Pro Tip: it can get pretty cold at night!)
- Toiletries**  
Hygiene products, shampoo, conditioner, soap, tooth brush, tooth paste, deoderant, contact solution, etc.
- Medication/ Dietary Needs**  
Any medication you will need to be at your healthiest. If you have food allergies and need special snacks we will provide a place for your youth ministry to access them for you (You may NOT keep food in the dorms)
- Non-perishable Donation**  
Please bring a new and unused non-perishable donation for one of the organization we serve. Examples: food, diapers, socks, small toiletries.
- Optional**  
Bible, journal, and/or devotionals. Spending money for the GSP store if desired, Anything needed for talent show.

# WHAT NOT TO BRING

*Cellphones/Internet capable devices, electronics/chargers/headphones, expensive jewelry, clothing/shoes that you don't want stained, electric hair styling tools like curling irons, shorts shorter than your fingertips, other clothing against dress code, blades/tools/lighters, drugs/alcohol/tobacco products/vapes, anything not conducive to a Christian Retreat.*
