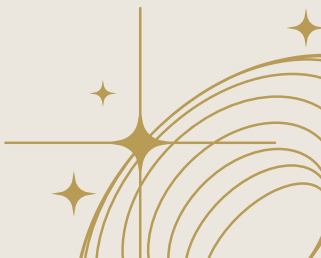




THE CATHOLIC PERSPECTIVE ON CONFLICT

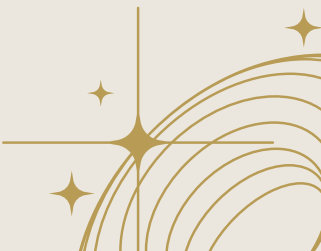
"Blessed are the peacemakers, for they shall be called children of God."
— *Matthew 5:9*

In Catholic teaching, conflict is not merely a problem to be avoided, but an opportunity for spiritual growth and deeper reconciliation. Rooted in Gospel values, we are called to approach disagreements with humility, compassion, and a commitment to peace. Through conflict, we can strengthen our bonds, practice forgiveness, and reflect Christ's love in our community.

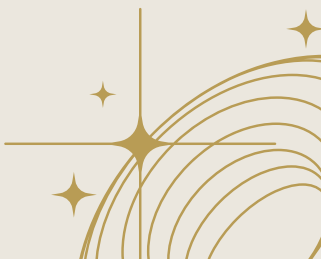

WHY CONFLICT RESOLUTION MATTERS?



- Unresolved conflict can fracture parish communities and erode trust
- Most church conflict begins with communication breakdowns, not major disagreements
- Unaddressed tension creates barriers to fellowship and team unity
- Healthy conflict resolution strengthens relationships and collaboration
- Compassionate and direct communication supports mission and spiritual growth

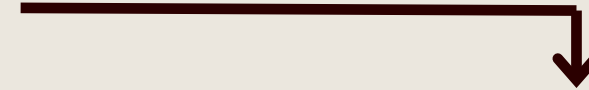

- Understand Conflict Styles
- Identify Root Causes
- Increase self-awareness



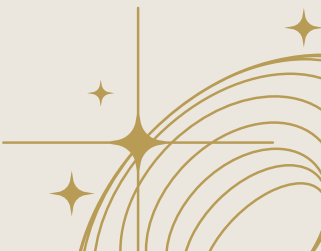
PART 2: COMMUNICATE CONSTRUCTIVELY DURING CONFLICT

- Practice Active Listening
- Address conflict directly & respectfully
- Manage emotions and difficult conversations



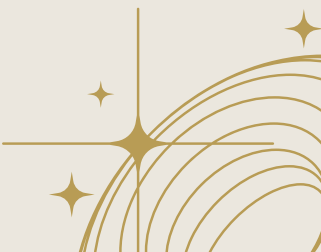

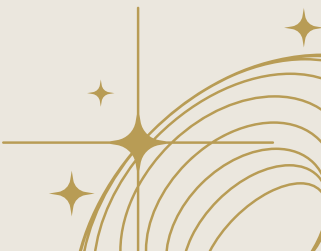
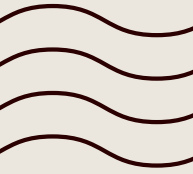
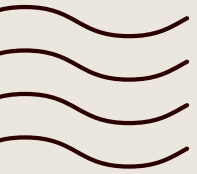
PART 1: ANALYZE & DIAGNOSE CONFLICT

- Understand your conflict-management style
- Identify the real causes of conflict
- Increase emotional and leadership self-awareness
- Recognize behaviors that escalate conflict
- Learn to approach conflict collaboratively



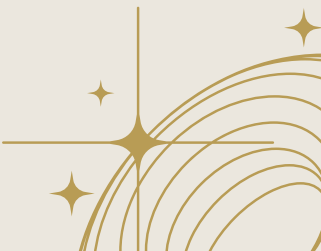
CONFLICT STYLES: UNDERSTANDING YOURSELF AND OTHERS

Style	Definition
Withdraw	Avoiding the conflict situation as much as possible
Agreeable	Deferring to the other person's point of view
Aggressive	Trying to convince the other person you are right
Collaborative	Working through issues to a mutually satisfactory agreement



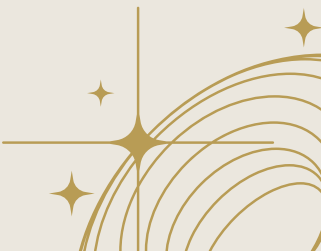
IDENTIFY CAUSES OF CONFLICT

- **Communication breakdowns**
- **Different goals, priorities, or expectations**
- **Misunderstandings and assumptions**
- **Stress, pressure, and emotional reactions**
- **Personality and leadership style differences**
- **Lack of clarity, resources, or support**



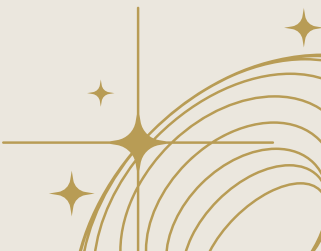
COMMUNICATION SKILLS

- Listen to understand, not to respond
- Ask clarifying and open-ended questions
- Pay attention to tone, body language, and emotions
- Avoid defensiveness, interruptions, and assumptions
- Focus on understanding before solving the problem



PART 2: COMMUNICATE CONSTRUCTIVELY DURING CONFLICT

- **Listening carefully**
 - **Tell me about...**
 - **Explain...**
 - **How do you feel about...**
 - **Describe...**
- **Avoid close-ended questions**
- **Periodically paraphrase what the speaker is saying**
 - **Active Listening**
- **Assess effectiveness of your interpretation**
 - **Are you understanding their point?**
- **Warning- Resist Interrupting**



SET THE TONE

Where:

Create a Safe Space: Find a neutral place, not across a desk i.e. conference room



Why:

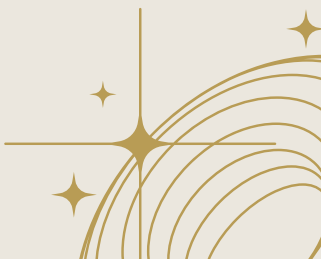
Begin with the purpose of the meeting: "I asked to meet with you..."

How:

Through Active listening, Mutual Respect, and non judgemental definition of the problem

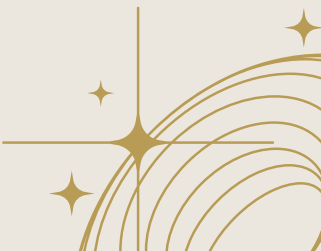
What:

Collaborative solutions and a plan to achieve them.



PART 3: COLLABORATE TO RESOLVE CONFLICT

- **Disagreement vs. Conflict**
- **Know each side**
- **Recognize when to intervene and when to coach**
 - **When coaching, include follow-ups or “temperature checks”**
- **Offer Mentoring**
 - **Brainstorm**
 - **Problem-Resolution Plan**



FACILITATING RESOLUTION FOR OTHERS

- **Communicate your perception about possible conflict**
- **Facilitate**
 - **Creating a Safe Space**
 - **Using “I” statements without blame**
 - **Asking clarifying questions to ensure understanding**
 - **Identifying the problem in specific terms**
 - **Active Listening with full attention and empathy**
 - **Finding Common Ground, Goals & Areas of Agreement**
- **State the desire resolution and commitment to it**

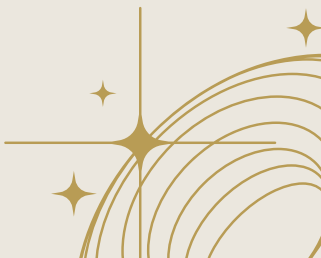


REFLECTION AND PRAYER

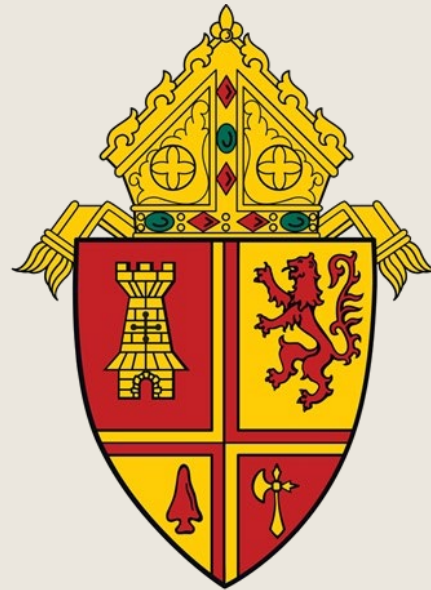
"Peace I leave with you; my peace I give you. I do not give to you as the world gives. Do not let your hearts be troubled and do not be afraid." – John 14:27
