7. Keep it simple.

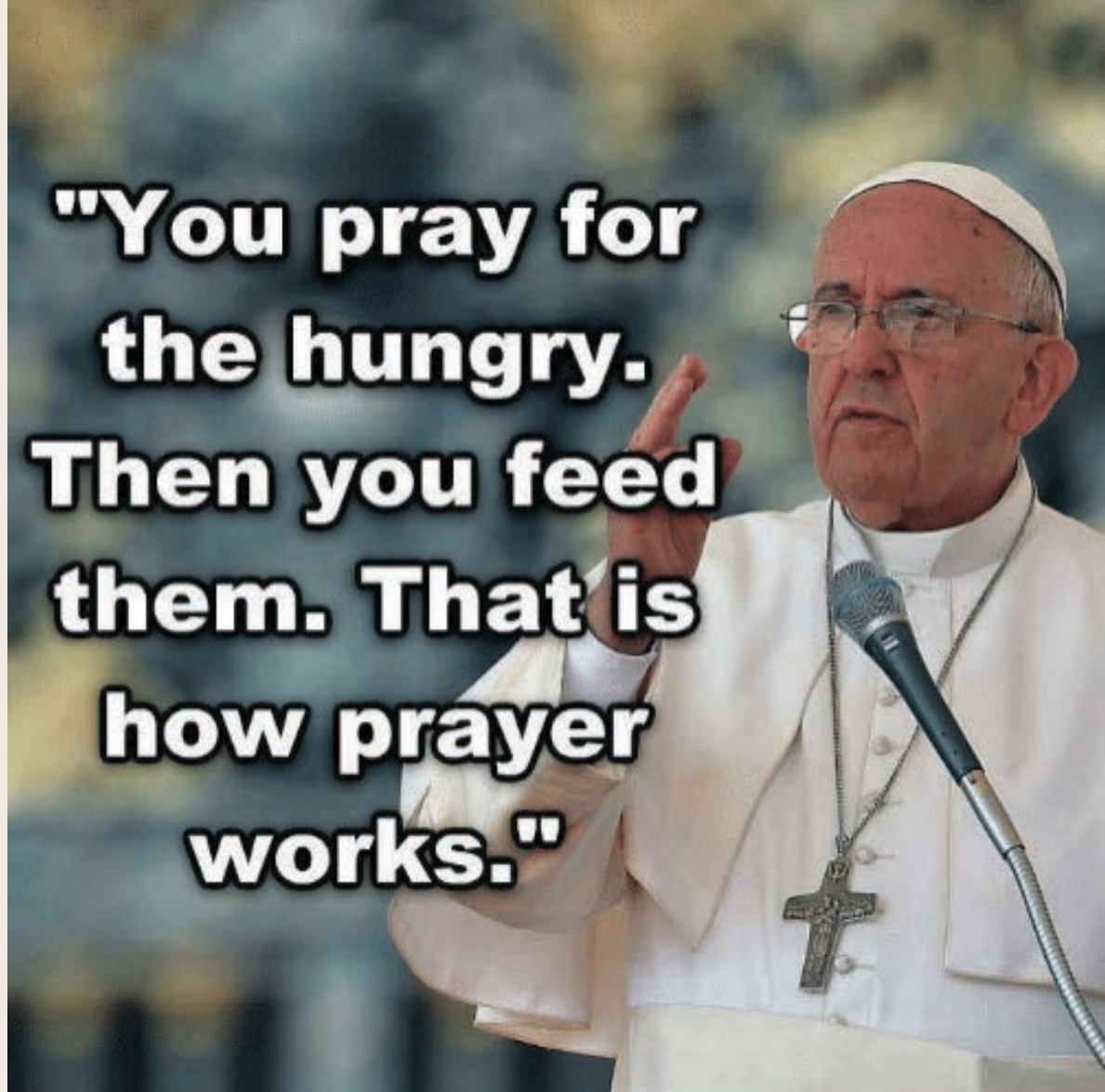


Week 3

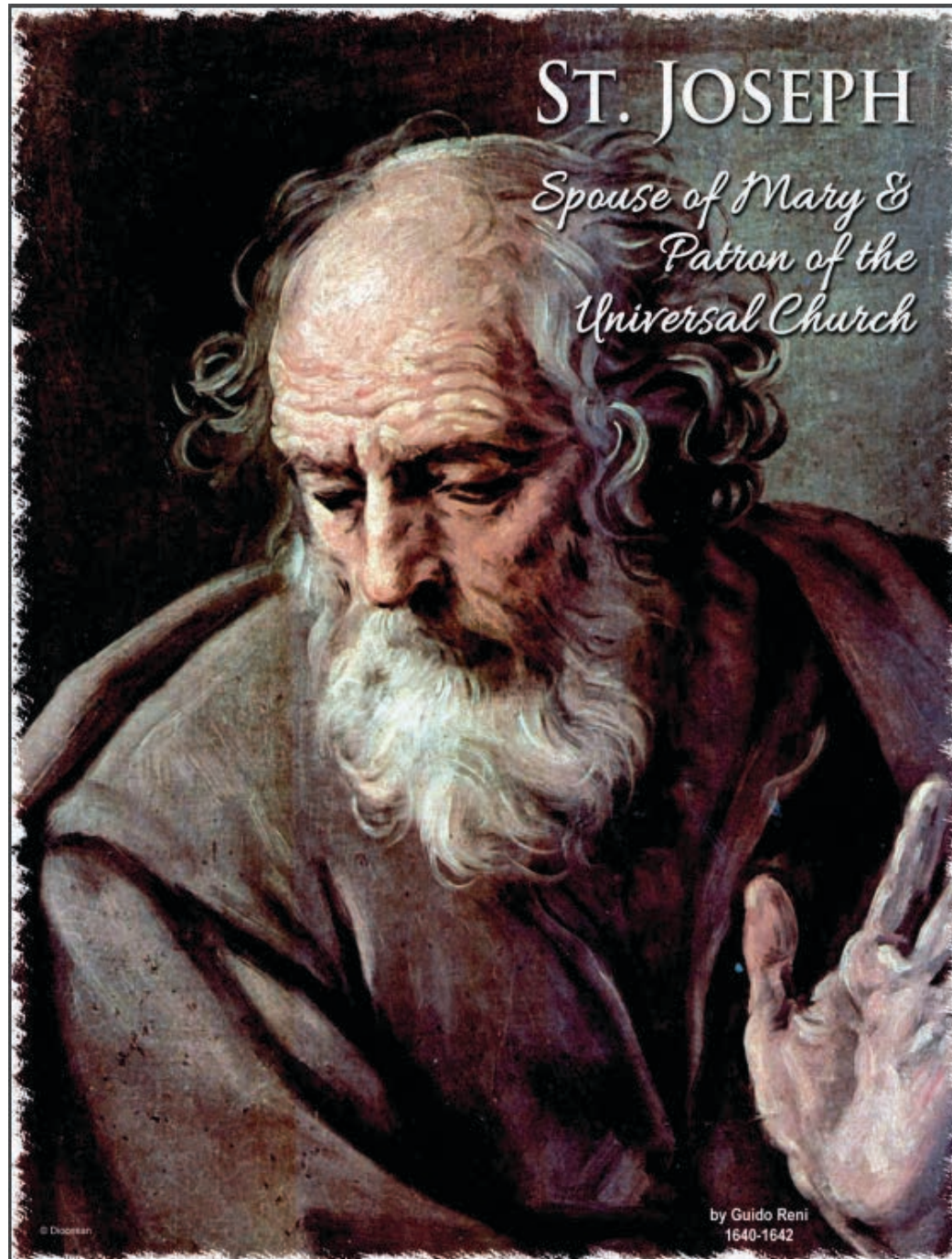

to come together to pray, to grieve and find comfort in the promises of Christ for eternal life for their loved ones and for themselves. At this Mass I took the opportunity to offer words of thanks to the members of the recently inaugurated Ministry of Consolation. The Ladies and Gentlemen of this ministry have provided a wonderful gift to our grieving families by acting as greeters, liturgical ministers, bakers, by creating memorial booklets for each individual funeral; in essence by being the face of Christ to our brothers and sisters in some of the saddest times they and their families have faced. I can't thank them enough for the support and care they have given and continue to give to our grieving families. Members are always needed to help in this ministry. You do not need to have any prior experience, but simply a desire to help. Now you may feel that you have nothing to offer or may feel that you are unable to walk with a grieving family, but actually you can still be part of this ministry. Help with producing the booklets, writing consolation cards for the families, or even baking a cake are integral parts to this ministry. If you are interested in participating, please contact Angela Manzi through the rectory office for more details.

This week marks what you might call the final countdown to our liturgical year. In a few short weeks we will celebrate the Feast of Christ the King of the Universe, which, by the way, will close the Year of Mercy. The following weekend, (Thanksgiving weekend), we will celebrate the first Sunday of Advent. As we move to the end of the year our readings take on a definitely more apocalyptic tone. This week our Gospel has the story of Jesus interaction with the Sadducees, who were the political and aristocratic elite of his time. They adopted Greek culture and customs while remaining Jewish. They also controlled the priesthood and the temple functions and often found themselves in direct opposition to the Pharisees, a group more closely associated with Jesus. In our gospel today they pose a question to Jesus. The Sadducees did not believe in a resurrection of the dead. They instead believed that when you died you went to Sheol, a place of nothingness. The Pharisees, however believed in a resurrection, though there was much disagreement in what that resurrection would be. In the first of the gospels today the Sadducees pose a trick question to Jesus about a woman who was married and died leaving no children. In order to live on in the Jewish culture his brother was called to marry her and raise up children in his memory. The story they tell goes on to say the woman married each of seven brothers in succession, each one dying and leaving no heirs, till finally the woman herself dies. (Honestly, I think she might have died of grief and exhaustion after so many husbands!). In the Jewish culture of Jesus day children were seen as a way of living on in the world. As long as you had children you were in a sense immortal, because they carried your blood forward. For the Sadducees there was no need for a resurrection if your blood line continued on. At the same time the Sadducees were mocking the idea of a bodily resurrection with a farfetched scenario. But there is a serious trap here couched in the funny plot they set up. If Jesus says the brothers should not marry the woman then he would be seen as denying the laws of Moses and not a good and faithful Jew and if he denies the bodily resurrection, then he pits himself against his own community, the Pharisees. Their plan backfires though. Jesus does neither, but instead points to the scriptures for the truth with an answer that silences them. He states that when God appears to Moses in the burning bush, a pivotal point in the Jewish faith, he identifies himself as the God of their fathers – the same fathers from whom they all claim to share blood with. He notes that if God identifies himself as the God of Abraham, Isaac and Jacob, then to God they are alive. They have not disappeared into nothingness but live on in his presence. He goes on to say that God is the God of the living not of the dead. If that is so, then so are all their descendents.

What does this have to do with us? We belong to the God of the living, not of the dead. I think we need to be reminded of this. This week we celebrated the saints, whose extraordinary lives we hold up as an example, and we remembered on All Souls Day our loved ones who have journeyed before us marked with faith. In a sense we are just as Jesus proclaimed in the gospel; we belong to the God of the living! We need to have hope and we need encouragement to continue on our pilgrim way. Jesus reassures us in this Gospel that there is still something more that God has in store for us. Though times may seem bleak, he wants us to

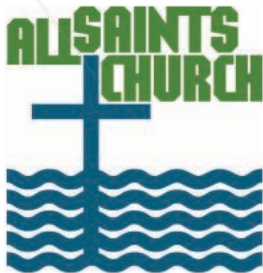

PASTOR'S NOTES

I would like to thank everyone who donated and or purchased an item during our online Spectacular auction event. Our net profit for the event was \$43,269. Of that \$43,269, \$8,250 was earmarked for the Tuition Assistance Fund and the remainder folds into our Operating Fund so that we can support our multiple ministries. In comparison to prior years, in 2016 our net profit was \$79,000 and in 2015 our net profit was \$64,000.

As you know, we have just finished our parish wide survey regarding fundraising activities. We are still in the process of reviewing those results. Parish Center Rooms: All Parish Center rooms, including the Jubilee Room, must be reserved in advance. The Parish Center is unavailable for any youth and/or sports related parties. Special permission is required to serve food and drink in all PC Rooms, except Room 7 and the Jubilee Room.

Holy Orders: Call Deacon Bob Lever for explore the possibility of a vocation to the Ordained Priesthood, Diaconate or Vowed Religious Life for Women and Men.

Adult Initiation into the Catholic Faith: Adults who would like to learn more about the Catholic Faith or who wish to become Catholic may call Brian Caperton, Pastoral Associate, at 792-4604.

All volunteers who are in contact with children at All Saints must be approved to work with children according to the Archdiocese Decree on Child Protection. To accomplish this, one must 1) attend a VIRTUS Session, 2) submit to the online Selection.com background check and be cleared by the Archdiocese of Cincinnati, and 3) be up to date on VIRTUS readings.

An Important Message about VIRTUS: All volunteers who work with children must complete the VIRTUS class and be up to date in reading the VIRTUS training bulletins. The most recent list of VIRTUS approved volunteers is listed on the All Saints webpage.

To complete the VIRTUS training requirement:

- You must preregister before taking a VIRTUS class. Register online at the VIRTUS website, www.virtusonline.org to sign up for a class, and attend a session, which is approximately 3 hours in length.
- You may sign up at any location listed on the VIRTUS website: www.virtusonline.org.
Click on the green tab, "First Time Registrants"
Then click "Begin Registration Process"
Choose "Cincinnati, OH (Archdiocese)"
You will then create your VIRTUS account- remember your password!
- Once you are registered on the website, you will receive an email confirming your registration.
- You will then stay up-to-date through their monthly training bulletins, which require you to answer a question to stay current. If you fall behind reading these bulletins by three months in a row, your VIRTUS approval will be automatically cancelled. If you fall behind 6 readings or more, the Archdiocese will inactivate your account. Therefore, it is important to stay current with reading in order to maintain "approved" status.

New bulletins are posted on the website on the first Sunday of the month. **IMPORTANT:** After reading the training bulletin, please remember to answer the question at the end. This is how VIRTUS knows you read the bulletin. Thank you to everyone who volunteers their time at All Saints.



Interfaith Hospitality Network

The mission of Interfaith Hospitality Network of Greater Cincinnati is to provide homeless families emergency shelter and hospitality through interfaith communities and to work with families to find and retain stable housing.

A traditional day at IHN Day Center includes placing all school aged children back in the classroom they were in prior to becoming homeless. Three days a week, all adult guests are required to attend child development, budgeting, and life skill classes. A case manager works with the family to develop a plan to accomplish housing and employment. Families also receive complete access to health care. The guests leave the Day Center at 5pm and travel by bus to the host congregation. When guests get off the bus, they are greeted by volunteers who provide a hot, home-cooked meal. Guests and volunteers are encouraged to enjoy the meal together. After dinner, volunteers lead activities for the guests. This can be structured activity, or just play time with kids to give adult guests a few moments of peace and time to pack lunches for the next day. Guests are then given private sleeping quarters for their family. In the morning, volunteers wake up the guests, provide a quick breakfast and then it's back to the Day Center. The first hosting for IHN 2018 will be **Sunday, January 14 and Tuesday, January 16 from 5-8pm** at St. Paul's United Methodist Church in Madeira.

All Saints is a support congregation and provides volunteers for various positions for both days. 4 to 5 Cooks are needed to prepare parts of the meal for 15-20 people. 6 volunteers are needed to serve the meal, clean up the meal, and lead activities from 5-8pm. 2 overnight volunteers are needed to stay from 8pm until the guest families leave the next morning at 6-6:30 am to return to the Day Center in Walnut Hills.

We hope many more volunteers will join this ministry that has housed homeless families in Greater Cincinnati for over 25 years. This past year, 340 families were aided in housing with 65% of those served being children under the age of 18. The program is very successful with statistics stating that 93% of the families do not return to the program. Future dates of hosting include May 6th, May 8th, August 26th and August 28.
