

## **Home Schooling**

- If a student leaves a Catholic School to be home schooled, the parents should be notified in writing that they need to register with the public school district. A copy of the letter should be placed in the student's file. A withdrawal form signed by both parents/guardians should be completed and kept in the student's file. The following should be part of the letter sent to the parent. It is from the law governing home schooling.

“The parent shall notify the district school superintendent of the county in which the parent resides of her or his intent to establish and maintain a home education program. The notice shall be in writing, signed by the parent, and shall include the names, addresses, and birth dates of all children who shall be enrolled as students in the home education program. The notice shall be filed in the district school superintendent's office within 30 days of the establishment of the home education program. A written notice of termination of the home education program shall be filed in the district school superintendent's office within 30 days after said termination.”

- If a school considers accepting a home schooled student, the following information and procedures are required:
  - A copy of the public school registration form
  - The log of the educational activities in which the student participated
  - A copy of the annual evaluation accepted by the public school district
  - A copy of the review of the annual evaluation by the district indicating the successful completion of the term of home schooling
  - An assessment by the Catholic School for placement purposes
- Students who are home schooled are not eligible to participate in any school related activity.
