- Standard 1: The student who is information literate accesses information efficiently and effectively.
 - * Recognizes the need for information
 - Recognizes that accurate and comprehensive information is the basis for intelligent decision making
 - * Formulates questions based on information needs
 - * Identifies a variety of potential sources of information
 - Develops and uses successful strategies for locating information

Catholic Indicators:

- † Recognizes that accurate and comprehensive information is the basis for intelligent moral decision making
- † Formulates questions based on ethical consideration
- † Understands relevance of current level of self awareness
- Standard 2: The student who is information literate evaluates information critically and competently.
 - * Determines accuracy, relevance and comprehensiveness
 - * Distinguishes among facts, point of view, and opinion
 - Identifies inaccurate and misleading information
 - Selects information appropriate to the problem or question at hand

- † Evaluates information with a Catholic perspective.
- † Seeks to incorporate (or apply) catholic perspective to the problem or question at hand.
- † Always seeks truth when researching information
- † Puts information into Catholic perspective and responds accordingly.

- Standard 3: The student who is information literate uses information accurately and creatively.
 - * Organizes information for practical application
 - * Integrates new information into one's own knowledge
 - * Applies information in critical thinking and problem solving
 - * Produces and communicates information and ideas in appropriate formats.

- † Uses information to apply Catholic moral outlook.
- † Applies Catholic teaching doctrine in critical thinking and problem solving
- † Recognizes information that is in line with Catholic teaching and discriminates inclusion of information appropriately.
- † Uses Catholic ideology to produce and communicate information and ideas in appropriate formats.
- Standard 4: The student who is an independent learner is information literate and pursues information related to personal interests.
 - * Seeks information related to various dimensions of personal well-being, such as career interests, community involvement, health matters, and recreational pursuits.
 - * Designs, develops, and evaluates information products and solutions related to personal interests

 - * Is competent and self-motivated reader
 - * Derives meaning from information presented creatively in a variety of formats.
 - * Develops creative products in a variety of formats.

- † Develops the knowledge and appreciate of Catholic authors and writings.
- † Develops an ability to develop Catholic values through reading.
- † Develops the ability to discern Catholic values within all literature.
- † Develops creative products in a variety of formats consistent with the values of the Catholic Church

Standard 6: The student who is an independent learner is information literate and strives for excellence in information seeking and knowledge generation.

- * Assesses the quality of the process and products of personal information seeking
- Devises strategies for revising, improving, and updating selfgenerated knowledge

- † While assessing processes and products, students use Catholic beliefs and faith as a moral "litmus" test to evaluate the way information was attained and the final product.
- † Giving correct citations/copyright source information is also emphasized.
- † While discerning knowledge, they morally assess what they produce and how they are doing it, based on Catholic ethics.

- Standard 7: The student who contributes positively to the learning community and to society is information literate and recognizes the importance of information to a democratic society.
 - * Seeks information from diverse sources, contexts, disciplines and cultures.
 - * Respects the principle of equitable access to information

- † Seeks information from diverse Catholic sources
- † Recognizes that being information literate is not separate from being part of God's family
- † Observes the regulations regarding access to information consistent with church teachings
- Standard 8: The student who contributes positively to the learning community and to society is information literate and practices ethical behavior in regard to information and information technology.
 - Respects the principles of intellectual freedom
 - * Respects intellectual property rights
 - * Uses information technology responsibly

- † Student will understand that academic integrity is a moral as well as legal issue.
- † Catholicism scope of appropriate/available information sources at the same time
- † Moral responsibility of students

- Standard 9: The student who contributes positively to the learning community and to society is information literate and participates effectively in groups to pursue and generate information.
 - * Shares knowledge and information with others
 - Respects others' ideas and backgrounds and acknowledges their contributions
 - Collaborates with others, both in person and through technologies, to identify information problems and to seek their solutions
 - Collaborates with others, both in person and through technologies, to design, develop and evaluate information products and solutions

- † Seek and evaluates information products and solutions based on Catholic information and values
- † Makes and shares moral judgment on Catholic teachings
- † Applies acquired knowledge and information according to Catholic values
