



The Bronze Pelican Award is a local recognition approved by the Catholic Committee on Scouting for the Diocese of St. Petersburg. It may be presented to any adult who is working in the Scouting program under Catholic auspices, to Catholics in Scout units not chartered by the Church, and to those who have made significant contribution to Scouting in the field of Catholic relationships. This award may be given to Catholic laymen and women, priests, brothers, nuns or non-Catholics. **No honorary recognitions will be made.**

The purpose of this program is to recognize the recipient's outstanding contribution to the development of Catholic youth in the program of the Boy Scouts of America.

Recipients of the award must be exemplary adults and those recipients who are Catholic *must have the approval of their respective pastors* before the award is given. Non-Catholics must have the approval of the Executive Officer (Pastor) of the unit.

Each Unit, Parish or Boy Scout Council is requested to submit the name of a possible candidate annually for the reception of this award. A candidate may be submitted by a Scout Committee in his Parish, by a group of individuals who are active in youth ministry in the Parish, or by the Pastor.

The Catholic Committee on Scouting for the Diocese of St. Petersburg will be permitted two (2) awards annually for every 20 Catholic chartered units or fractions thereof with the emphasis on the importance of being selective and that there be no feelings that the full quota must be used every year. *No Honorary recognitions will be made.*

The recipients of the award are to be sought after and selected by an active committee of three to five members who are past recipients of the Bronze Pelican award. The diocesan chair and chaplain will appoint a new selection committee annually at least 60 days before the date of the award presentation.

Recommendations should carefully detail how the nominee meets the guidelines for selection. The Bronze Pelican recommendations are evaluated on the basis of the guidelines described.

If a candidate has already been presented with the St. George Emblem he or she may not be nominated for the Bronze Pelican Award in the Diocese of St. Petersburg.

Observing the use and value of an award presented to adults for outstanding service and the contribution to the development of Catholic youth in the program of the Boy Scouts of America, the Catholic Committee on Scouting for the Diocese of St. Petersburg recommended the implementation of the Bronze Pelican in September, 1983. The Most Reverend W. Thomas Larkin, Bishop of St. Petersburg approved the Bronze Pelican as a diocesan recognition in October 1983.

Guidelines for the unit, parish or council selection committee:

The following are some examples or a combination of which might make a unit leader, committee member, clergy, religious, parent, or supporter of the Scouting ministry a possible candidate for this recognition:

1. Promotes all Religious Emblems Awards;
2. Promotes the Religious observance of Scout Sunday;
3. Helps to preserve and develop Catholic chartered units;
4. Recruits Christian men and women to further the ideals of Scouting as a Youth Ministry;
5. Demonstrates leadership and dedication in the Scouting on a Parish, Unit, District or Council level;
6. Works to maintain excellent cooperation with the parish / diocese, the Council Scout office and its programs;
7. Consistently maintains and interprets to the Council the Catholic attitude and Identity towards Scouting and thus becomes responsible for having religious policies carried out to the benefit of the Catholic boys / girls within the area;
8. Meets all diocesan guidelines for volunteers working with youth.
9. Should have participated in the Lay Apostolate Formation for Scouters program;
10. Actively participates in the Cub Scout Retreats, Boy Scout Retreats, Bishop Scout Sunday and other programs of the Catholic Committee on Scouting.

NOTE: Work accomplishments and dedication is the major criteria for receiving this award although a minimum of three years of service to youth and Scouting, with two years in our Diocese, is required.

Nomination of a candidate is to be kept confidential. The Committee making the recommendation will be notified of the results. If a candidate is not selected for the current year your nomination form will be returned and information may be updated and resubmitted the following year.

NOMINATION DEADLINE:

Nominations of a candidate are due on or before December 1 of each calendar year. It is suggested the unit, parish or an individual start gathering all required information by October 15 in order to complete all the required and necessary paperwork, which must accompany your recommendation.
